

NOTICE

The Births and Deaths Registration Act 1953 provides that when a child is given a name in baptism* within 12 months after registration of birth, that name can be inserted in the birth entry if the child's birth was registered in a different name or without a name.

This certificate should be completed and signed by the Minister or person who performed the baptism or who has custody of the register in which the baptism is recorded; he will be entitled to a fee of £1.00. The certificate should then be taken to the registrar or the superintendent registrar who has custody of the register in which the child's birth was registered. The registrar or superintendent registrar will enter the new name in the space provided for it in the child's birth entry. The name or names inserted entirely supersede any name of the child already appearing in the entry.

**Baptism means the rite or ceremony of the Christian Church.*
